

# AirVenture 2026 Forum - Sharing the Skies - What Pilots Should Know About Drones

## Event Details

You'll learn about key limitations that drone pilots must follow—like visual line of sight, altitude caps, and restricted operations over people—and why most drone flights are far more constrained than many manned pilots realize. We'll also explain how manned and unmanned aircraft can share airspace safely, and what tools like DROTAMs and ADS-B (or lack thereof) mean for situational awareness.

Taught by a CFI who also taught over 100,000 remote pilots, this talk will give you the confidence to understand, anticipate, and safely coexist with drones in the NAS. No fluff—just facts, context, and actionable knowledge.
