

AirVenture 2026 Forum - Kicking Tin - What I Learned From the Crash Site

The Aviation Industry not only supports FAA/NTSB-led Investigations as a party member, it also conducts independent, parallel investigations to provide continuous operational safety. Jointly, with the FAA, industry monitors and tracks every aviation accident or incident that occurs domestically, or involves a US registered aircraft abroad. Daily, industry responds to the FAA preliminary accident data in the Preliminary Accident/Incident Database, which is shared with the Aviation Safety Information Analysis and Sharing (ASIAS) program. Jointly with the NTSB and the FAA "Go-Team", industry stands ready to launch on major accidents. These accidents typically included FAR Part 121 Air Carriers, or FAR Part 135 operators. This presentation will utilize case studies and past experiences to convey how continuous aviation safety is improved and enhanced.
