

## Guest Speakers



**Paul Berge** is a writer and pilot. He became a private pilot while in the Army stationed in Hawaii in 1975, where he learned that cross-country navigation consisted of flying from island to island over long stretches of shark-infested sea (one reason he moved to Iowa). In the late 1970's he graduated from the University of California and was hired by the FAA as an air traffic controller. He held that position until 1997 when he left to teach flying full-time, which in Iowa means about half-time, since half of the year the airplane is frozen inside the hangar or out of annual. Although a CFII, he mostly gives primary instruction or tail wheel training in his 1946 Aeronca Champ. He also teaches ground school at

Southwestern Community College in Osceola, Iowa.

Paul is Vice President of the Iowa Aviation Promotion Group (IAPG) and is on the National Board of Directors for the Antique Airplane Association (AAA). He's written for several aviation journals including, Private Pilot, Plane & Pilot, General Aviation News, Aviation Safety, Aviation Consumer and Pilots Audio Update. He was the editor of IFR magazine for 5 years and has written the AVWeb Brainteaser quizzes since 2002. His other works include the novel, Bootleg Skies and two collections of aviation short stories: Ailerona and the Logbook. His latest book is The Private Pilot Wellness Guide.

Outside of aviation Paul co-produced and hosted the long-running radio drama series, Rejection Slip Theater on WHO-1040 (now podcast) as well as hosted and wrote the IPTV series Side Roads on Living in Iowa. Paul lives in Indianola, Iowa, is married to a veterinarian, and they have a teenage daughter who knows more than they do.




