A Data-Driven Approach to Lowering GA Accidents

This is not a webinar – but an interactive, face-to-face seminar focusing on improving aviation safety.

The Nall report, now in its 26th edition, is published by the Air Safety Institute (part of AOPA) and provides data and commentary on the state of general aviation safety. The report generates much discussion and action by organizations such as the ASI, AOPA, FAA and others – and they produce excellent material for us to study and review. But even though the actual number of accidents has been slowly reducing over time, the rate of improvement does not seem to be in line with the expended effort - although we will take all we can get. So, what else must be done to change the accident statistics – and who should do it?

This seminar strives to improve the numbers by direct, continuous and active management of the factor that gives us 75% of all accidents – ourselves. Using data from the Nall report, we explore the major causal factors of pilot related accidents, and from this, reinforce essential knowledge and training methods that have perhaps been previously imposed, rather than fully understood.
