

Avoiding Controlled Flight Into Terrain

Pilots of all certificate levels are prone to CFIT accidents.

Most General Aviation CFIT accidents occur during the day and half occur in VMC.

Pilots must accurately assess flight risks, plan accordingly, continuously reassess risk en route, and commit to alternate plans before they are in a state of emergency
