Don't Lose Your Medical

Many common conditions, and illnesses may not require Special Issuance. At this event you will learn what is acceptable, and what is not. The AME has authorization to issue a certificate for various conditions that were previously under Special Issuance, such as hypertension, asthma, thyroid disease, colitis, glaucoma and others.

Many common conditions, and illnesses may not require special issuance.

Have you had a skin lesion or small tumor removed? What about a broken bone? As pilots get older, joint replacement becomes common, and eyesight deteriorates. What about laser eye surgery? Flight bag become too heavy? What about hernias? Colonoscopy is recommended for those over 50 years of age. Is this considered 'surgical'? Do I need to report it to the FAA? Pneumonia, bronchitis, arthritis and all the other 'itis'.....What about these?

Doctor Manuel Ceja, a distinguished AME, will discuss many non-disqualifying conditions that are thought to be disqualifying, and for those which require a 'special issuance', the manner in which a pilot can request one. Don't fly with a medical condition for fear of losing your privileges!
