Event Details

This presentation is to encourage flight students and instructors to work together to see and experience weather conditions during flight training. Many issues pilots face with weather stem from poor decision-making. However, good decision-making starts with understanding. Topics will include atmospheric instability, convection, isolated thunderstorms, squall lines, icing, haze, and more. I'll also cover examples of forecast elements that often signal hazardous conditions and provide a basic overview of what a radar is. The goal is to give students and instructors a stronger grasp of how to identify risks and make informed, confident decisions based on real understanding. One bad decision doesn't have to ruin a flight unless it's followed by more.
