

FAA Safety Team presents:

Medical Certification of Certain Small Aircraft Pilots

On July 15, 2016 the President of the United States signed into law, HR-636, Public Law 114-190, "The FAA Extension, Safety and Security Act of 2016." Section 2307 of the Act entitled, "Medical Certification of Certain Small Aircraft Pilots," allows certain pilots to fly using their driver's license instead of an FAA Medical Certificate.

This program will examine all aspects and provisions of the Act, including the criteria for flying with a valid driver's license, along with the Act's exclusions. The program is a must for any pilot, instructor, operator, or aircraft owner considering flying with a valid U.S. driver's license under Section 2307 of the "Act." Further, since the "Act" must be implemented by the FAA no later than 180 days from the date the "Act" became law, it is important to attend an FAA Safety Team Seminar on the subject to gain the requisite knowledge regarding your ability and responsibilities to fly using a U.S. driver's license.
