

Chicken Heart: analysis of a real IFR cross-country flight

This is the analysis of an actual round trip flight conducted in the summer of 2009 from Caldwell, NJ to Mackanac Island, Michigan. Weather maps, photos and commentary are used to demonstrate how a light airplane can be safely navigated around and through rapidly changing weather conditions. The flight also shows the way the airplane can be used to access interesting places that would be far more difficult or impossible to access via any other travel mode.
