**Rotor Rooter: Rooting for Autorotational Success Course at
HELI-EXPO 2013**

The Rotor Rooter Program is an FAA Safety Team (FAASTeam) education initiative aimed at reducing light helicopter training accidents in support of the IHST's accident reduction goals. Analysis reveals that approximately 18% of all helicopter accidents occur during training, while a large portion of these accidents occur during autorotation training.

The Rotor Rooter-Acronym Series provides pilots with user friendly acronyms to help them systematically identify, quantify, and mitigate certain risk factors associated with autorotations. These memory aids can help pilots remember critical factors, while also emphasizing the importance of utilizing systematic procedures for defending against risk factors inherent with autorotation training. Registration is not required for this course. HOWEVER, if you wish to receive FAA WINGS Program credit you MUST register in advance of the course on the FAASafety.gov web site.

This course is offered at the HAI Rotor Safety Challenge at HELI-EXPO 2013. Safety Challenge courses are FREE to all HELI-EXPO 2013 attendees. Courses are offered in 4 different safety tracks: Flight Operations,
