**Surviving the Inadvertent IMC Environment Course at HELI-
EXPO 2013**

This course will teach attendees about the hazards of flight into conditions that lead to Inadvertent Instrument Meteorological Conditions (IIMC) and provide them with strategies to avoid unintentional entry into IIMC and tips for how to successfully recover from an Instrument Meteorological Conditions (IMC) encounter. This course will also explore the safety considerations for potential IIMC encounters and the human errors that can occur in pre-flight planning and/or flight executive and result in unintentional IMC flight and its catastrophic results.

Course topics will include: an overview of fatal IIMC accident data and error analysis; human factors and limitations such as internal and external pressures, ego, physiological factors, and spatial orientation; effective avoidance strategies (to include Safety Management Systems (SMS) based planning); and techniques and procedures to help pilots avoid or survive an IIMC incident.
