The IIMC Threat: Avoidance and Survival Course at HELI-EXPO 2014

Inadvertent flight into instrument meteorological conditions (IIMC) continues to be one of the leading lethal threats to helicopter operators. Despite advances in aircraft and avionics, the industry continues to suffer IIMC-related fatalities year after year. This course will look at the unique aspects of IIMC and why it continues to claim so many lives. IIMC survival methods based on a safety management system approach, including training, crew resource management, policy suggestions, and survival techniques, will be discussed.

Students will learn: The fundamental aspects of IIMC and why they differ from planned flight into IMC How one can better deal with inadvertent flight into IMC through training, procedure changes, crew resource management, and flying techniques.
