**Rotor or Not-Here We Come- Managing Cockpit Distractions at  
HAI HELI-EXPO 2016**

When flying helicopters, managing distractions plays a critical role in safety. Whether a mission involves a local flight or a cross-country, the amount of attention and preparation that goes into each flight is usually reflected in the results. Maintaining one's focus is better than being caught off guard and falling behind the aircraft. Pilots who are mentally prepared and remain focused on the task at hand are more likely to handle normal and abnormal situations in the cockpit successfully. Thinking ahead while staying focused on the task at hand is the name of the game. Tips offered during this presentation will help mitigate the consequences of distractions just waiting to ensnare pilots without warning.
