

## sUAS Maintenance - Whose Job Is It?

This session will present the technical, fiscal, and safety benefits of consistent, scheduled maintenance for sUAS (small unmanned aircraft systems). We will review 14 CFR Part 107 and its scarcity of solid direction regarding maintenance, as well as the difference between “airworthy” and “safe for flight” as they apply to sUAS. Attendees will learn about a suggested maintenance program for items specific to the sUAS that is based upon a manned rotorcraft maintenance program.
