Operations in controlled airspace and at towered airports is standardized across the National Airspace System (NAS), however, there are many characteristics that are unique to certain sections of airspace and to individual airports. They will refresh your knowledge of Class C operational procedures, towered airport operations, taxi procedures, and airport signage. Also, did you know that ninety-five percent or more of flight time logged by private pilots takes place in daylight. This statistic seems to warrant a close review of night flying techniques, since we seem to fly at night so infrequently.
