Is This Airplane Safe to Fly?

Seminar Details: 10:40 AM Classroom A - Is this Airplane Safe To Fly, presented by Tim Haley, FAA Airworthiness Inspector, Aerobatic Pilot, and aircraft owner. Aircraft owners, operators, and renters are responsible for the airworthiness of an airplane, not a mechanic. Just because an airplane has successfully completed an annual inspection last week is no guarantee it is "airworthy" today. Plus a mechanic does not inspect an aircraft for required documents in the aircraft flight manual and/or on the flight deck. Learn how to manage inoperative equipment and what you can do before you fly to insure the aircraft you are about to fly is legal and safe to operate.
