Keynote Speaker



Stan Rose; Director of Safety for the Helicopter Association International

Stan Rose has been the Director of Safety for the Helicopter Association International since 2010. He has been involved in the helicopter industry for more than 40 years and has served in numerous and varied positions. He has been a pilot, a Program Director for Air Medical operations, and a business development specialist. He has also worked on several overseas projects in both maintenance and operations roles.

Stan began his career as a U.S. Army pilot in Vietnam, and later attended the Maintenance Officer/Test Pilot Course with the U.S. Army Reserves before moving on to the civil helicopter industry. He has flown a variety of helicopter missions including Airborne Law Enforcement, Offshore oil production and Air Medicine.

Rose has been active in diverse public service assignments that include voluntary positions as Chairman of an EMS Council, the AAMS Board, a State Bioterrorism Preparedness Committee, and the FAA Part 135 Rule Making Committee. The experience that Rose has accumulated in maintenance, operations, management, and business development has been put to good use in his role as the Director of Safety for HAI.
