This month's topic is handling partial power loss. We drill for complete engine failure, but the most common engine problem is a partial loss of power. Will you recognize it promptly? How will you handle it? How can you be prepared in advance to make safe decisions?

Bring your EFB, your experience, and your questions, and be ready to participate.

All are welcome. You do not need to be an EAA member or rated instrument pilot to attend.

If you arrive by plane: Please park at the main ramp. Walk on the taxiway to the right of Midfield Cafe, between the buildings. The Airport Authority building is the third on the right, just before the Nashua Jet Aviation building.
