Don't Go Before You Know!

A thorough understanding of the different systems installed in the aircraft you fly is mission critical! As the pilot in command and final authority for the operation of the aircraft, systems knowledge is important in the event something goes wrong. This knowledge will give you a better understanding of what exactly is wrong and give you a better opportunity to react properly. In this seminar, we will explore all of the common aircraft systems including fuel, electrical, control systems, etc, and some of the lesser-known systems such as pitot-static drains and emergency avionics switch. Although the systems discussion is relevant to many GA aircraft, the emphasis is on the Piper Cherokee-series (PA-28) aircraft. Using this information, we'll demonstrate how to effectively cope with various in-flight emergencies, and even how to prevent the emergency from occurring in the first place!
