Some of the deadliest accidents involving airplanes have occurred not in the air, but on the runway. This problem, though simple on the surface, requires all parties involved in airport operations to work together to create a safer, more vigilant environment. The overall numbers are trending at a constant rate of approximately 975 runway incursions per year throughout the National Airspace System. So, how do you teach airport surface safety? Are you using the best practices recommended by the FAA and industry experts? Do you demonstrate the common errors? Flight Instructors, Ground Instructors, Designated Pilot Examiners, and Instructors in training are welcome and encouraged to attend. Join your flight instructor colleagues and take an active role in improving safety in flight training! Don't miss this important event!

Directions: From the North, follow I-95 Southbound. Take the first exit, 3A. Turn right off the ramp, go 1/2 mile, and turn left at Port City's sign. From the South, follow I-95 Northbound through the Hampton Tolls to exit 3. Turn left at the top of the ramp, go 1/4 mile to a light, turn right, entering Portsmouth International Airport at Pease. Go 1/2 mile, and turn left at Port City's sign. Premier Aviation is on second floor in the Port City Air building.
