Flychology-Aeronautical Decision Making

The presenter, who has a Ph. D. in psychology, will discuss several topics affecting aeronautical decision making:

- 1. Limits to visual perception that affect spotting traffic
- 2. Limits to attention that affect instrument scan
- 3. How habits can be good (allowing multitasking) and bad (causing oversights)
- 4. How deference to authority can work against you in an emergency
- 5. How cognitive distortions, such as misjudgement of danger, can negatively affect decisions

Visual examples will be presented for most topics; others will be illustrated by flight examples. Advice will be given for ways to correct each of these perceptual and cognitive distortions.
