

Wings Weekend Instructor's Guide to Flight Training

All participating pilots begin at the "Basic" level regardless of their accumulated certificates and ratings. Completing the basic level meets the requirements for the flight review. The Basic level includes 3 knowledge (ground) tasks and 3 flight tasks. Two of the knowledge tasks must be completed online and the third task may be completed by attending 2 one hour seminars or by completing other online courses.

The participating pilot must complete 3 Flight Tasks in order to meet the requirements for Wings at the Basic level. **There is no minimum time required for any of the flight tasks, but the participating pilot must demonstrate proficiency to Private Pilot PTS standards on each task.** A flight task may span multiple flights if necessary, or all three flight tasks may be completed in a single flight. If the participating pilot is quite competent, this may be accomplished in a relatively short period of time. For other pilots, more time will be required. Printed copies of the Private Pilot PTS sections that are reference will be available.

Flight task syllabuses are listed here. **Each of these tasks must be endorsed properly by the instructor.** The participating pilot then requests credit for the flight tasks online either directly from the instructor or by having another instructor or FAAS Team representative validate the activity by viewing the endorsements. **An instructor who does not use the Internet may still provide the flight training by making the proper endorsement and then sending the participant to a FAAS Team representative or another instructor for validation.** We will have computer stations with trainers for those of you who are new to this process, and representatives available to provide validation for instructors who are not able to use the Internet at Wings Weekend. **We are very glad to assist any instructor who is willing to volunteer to fly.**

Please note that in Syllabus 3, there are options, and the participating pilot can receive credit for preflight inspection, taxiing and radio work in addition to other activities as long as the PTS standards are observed and met.

14. Area of Operation VII, Task B: Navigation Systems and Radar Services – ¼ credit
15. Area of Operation VII, Task C: Diversion – ¼ credit
16. Area of Operation VII, Task D: Lost Procedures – ¼ credit

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17. Area of Operation IX, Task B: Basic Instrument Maneuvers, Constant Airspeed Climbs – ¼ credit
18. Area of Operation IX, Task C: Basic Instrument Maneuvers, Constant Airspeed Descents – ¼ credit
19. Area of Operation X, Task A: Emergency Approach and Landing – ¼ credit
20. Area of Operation XI: Night preparation – ¼ credit
