

Mountain Flying

Flying in mountainous areas is challenging, not only because operational altitudes and winds are higher, but also because weather reporting and off-airport landing opportunities are fewer than in other flight environments. Pilots are well advised to seek training and advice from local mountain flying experts. Experience in mountainous environments and knowledge of best mountain flying practices improve flight safety.

Directions: The event will be held in the airport terminal building. If driving, park adjacent to the terminal. If flying, park on the ramp in front of the terminal.
