

Lessons On Landing Dead Stick From A Glider Pilot

Glider pilots use skills gained from seeking turbulent air, constantly preparing to land in a farmer's field, and energy management to bring every landing to a safe conclusion. These are the lessons from 2,200 dead stick landings.

From the Twin Cities: Travel south on I-35. Exit on County Road 70/210th Street West. Turn east onto Juniper Way/210th Street. Juniper Way becomes 215th Street. Turn right (south) onto Highview Avenue. Turn left (east) onto 225th Street West. Take first left into airport hangar area on south side of airport. Park in front of large hangar. .
