The "Stabilized Approach" concept has been widely adopted by air carriers and other sectors of the aviation industry as a means to reduce pilot workload and enhance safety during one of the most critical phases of flight. Despite this, accidents continue to occur. This FAA Safety Short examines recent accidents involving unstabilized approaches, as well as discussing common themes and lessons to be learned.
