Mark Foisy is the current Unmanned Aircraft System (UAS) Specialist for the Great Lakes Region of Flight Standards, FAA. In short, Mark is the "go-to-guy" with regards to UAS questions and issues in the Great Lakes Region. Mark started with the FAA in 2009, as an Aviation Safety Inspector in the Portland OR, Certificate Management Office, with oversight of Horizon Air Industries, Inc. Horizon Air operates the Bombardier DHC-8-400 throughout the western North America. He worked closely with Horizon on many projects, including their Aviation Safety Action Program (ASAP), and certifying their Advance Qualification Program (AQP) for training their pilots. From 1999 to 2009, he flew for SkyWest Airlines and United Airlines. He flew many aircraft, from the 30-seat EMB-120, to the wide-body B-767. From 1989 to 1998, Mark flew F-16s in the USAF in various theaters around the world. He has a Bachelor of Science degree in Mechanical Engineering from the University of Michigan.
