

## Post Crash/Emergency Landing Survival for Pilots

All pilots are trained to perform emergency landings. However, nobody ever talks about what you should do after landing your aircraft. Do you stay close to your ship or do you walk away from it? Jelica Matic, a Master CFI and FAA FAASTeam Representative will share her experience as a survivor of a serious accident in Hawaii in 2004. She and her two passengers were badly burned in the crash of a single-engine Piper Warrior she landed in a lava field near Milolii Hawaii.
