Creating and Sticking to Personal Minimums

When is the last time you reviewed your personal minimums? Have you differentiated between pattern work and cross-country flights? How about crossing the mountains or flying into unfamiliar airports? In primary flight training, your CFI initially set minimum standards for winds and weather, and you were gradually taught to develop your own personal minimums. These minimums can be revised as you gain more experience and more capability.

Presenter and CFI Tiffany Brown will discuss how pilots can develop their own personal minimums, both in general and with a particular emphasis on wind. Tiffany will draw from her experience as a CFI, as well as her participation in the Air Race Classic, a 2400nm, 4-day race that covered 9 states. She and her partner specifically emphasized setting personal minimums prior to the air race to avoid that all too deadly disease known as "get-there-itis."

Pilots of all experience levels are encouraged to attend.
