Why do we study aviation accidents? Because the more we understand about them, the more likely we are to avoid or properly address the situation if it happens to us. We can sit on the ground and discuss factors leading to the accident, debate possible responses to the situation, and imagine other possible outcomes. Presenter and CFI Tim Johnson has selected a few accidents that relate to some of the factors we face as pilots in Colorado. Tim will present the facts, then lead a discussion about each to help us all increase the safety of our future flights. Pilots of all skill levels are encouraged to attend.
