

Two scenarios - a VFR and IFR problem to be solved

Sessions include both visual and instrumental scenarios from Airman caught up in difficult situations. Each starts with a short video which ends with a question, "So, what would you do?" Pre-flight planning and aeronautical decision making with all levels of experience will be included in the discussion.

Via I-215 to W700N exit traffic light, turn West; at N2200W traffic light turn left (S); in 100 yards, take first right (W); at end of road, turn left and park. CAP is on left (E) side.
