**High Altitude Hypoxia Training SEMINAR - Civil Aerospace  
Medical Institute - SAT Apr 9th 2016**

The Civil Aerospace Medical Institute (CAMI) and Willamette Aviation presents High Altitude, Low Oxygen Ground training seminar referenced in FAR 61.31 (g). The classroom portion of this training will cover high altitude, low oxygen physiology.

On both Friday and Saturday from 8am-10am, you can join presenters from the FAA's Civil Aerospace Medical Institute for an educational, in-depth look at human factors and how they can affect you in the cockpit. Then, you'll have your chance to complete your "flight" in the chamber. The Education Hangar doors open at 7:30am.

Please arrive early. The seminar starts promptly at 8am.

While attending the Hypoxia Seminar is not required to participate in the chamber, attendance in the class is recommended. Pilots will receive an FAA Form 3150-1, PHYSIOLOGICAL TRAINING, commonly referred to as the Blue Card, at the conclusion of the Chamber exercise.
