## Risk Management Beyond Go/No-Go Decision Making

In general aviation flying the pilot in command makes all the decisions. From pre-flight planning and the decision to initiate the flight, through fueling and loading the aircraft, to managing inflight equipment malfunctions, and possibly continuing to a destination with deteriorating weather. Most pilots are confident individuals who consider themselves to be good decisionmakers, but risk management is a skill that can be learned and improved. Too much of what we learn about flying comes from experience, including those "never again" moments.
