Stall / Spin Workshop: Understanding Why You Only Want To Be There On Purpose

This is not a 'How to spin' workshop. This is not an aerobic spin course. There are many myths about why and how an airplane stalls / spins and this workshop addresses these myths and identifies circumstances that can lead to accident stall/spin accidents. It is designed as an accident prevention tool to help pilots avoid stall/spin accident scenarios, and give pilots the tools to recover from stalls & spins successfully. Bring your POH and come prepared to participate.

Directions: From U.S. 60 or I-4 take County Line Road to Old Medula Road. Go East on Old Medula Road to the Sun 'n Fun Complex and enter the gate by the Museum. Proceed straight ahead on Doolittle Road to Sun 'n Fun Road. Turn left on Sun 'n Fun proceed to the last building on the left and park on the west side of the building. Main Studio entrance is on the north side (runway) side.

Fly-in: After landing inform tower / ground control you want to proceed to the FAA Safety Center. It is outside the secure airport area so you will taxi up to a gate which will open automatically. Proceed through and taxi to the FAA Safety Center - only building directly on the taxiway. Park on the grassy area on the north side of the taxiway.
