Being a safe pilot requires more than good stick and rudder skills. George Perry, AOPA's Air Safety Institute Senior Vice President discusses simple techniques that can increase pilot performance and reduce pilot error. How we approach decision making has an impact on our flying safety. Enjoying the freedom of flight is just as much about learning how to think as it is learning how to fly. This discussion looks at some of the time tested ways pilots in the safest sectors of aviation are "trained to think" about safety. These lessons learned are easily transferable to GA pilots and if followed can help pilots adopt a safety mindset and decrease decision based human error.
