Perhaps it's because of their inherent dangers of what we do, or our own perception that others are paying more attention to us, but we seem to have a powerful sense that it's a good thing to look back at the mistakes of others and glean what we can from them in order to make ourselves safer. The hope is that we can learn lessons, remember them, and then recognize similar situations when we find ourselves stumbling into them.
