Loss of control is still a primary causal factor in aircraft accidents. This interactive seminar will:

- Review the aerodynamics of Angle of Attack;
- Present information on the benefits and use of Angle of Attack indicators installed in general aviation aircraft; and
- Reduce the likelihood of loss of control accidents by raising awareness of Angle of Attack.

This seminar will last approximately one hour. Participate in the WINGS Pilot Proficiency Program - It's the right thing to do for safety. Key benefits include: It makes one a more competent and confident pilot. It's easy to get involved and track your progress. It satisfies the flight review requirements for pilots.
