Will you properly evaluate your situation, will you succumb to "get-there-itis"; will you (like Anna & Kristoff) bravely save your kingdom from winter's cold grip on your flight? Perhaps you have very limited experience with forecast icing conditions and encounters with icing while flying in Florida; however, it is possible to accrete ice in Florida's skies, and if you ever fly in the northern part of the US winter icing conditions exist frequently. Come share your experiences and increase your knowledge of analyzing weather conditions and dealing with icing enroute. None of us are immune from potential problems like those experienced by our scenario aviator; we need to be prepared and learn from each other. This WINGS event will yield 1 Advanced Knowledge credit and is available for all pilots who attend. This seminar also serves as the monthly IMC Club meeting.
