So, you've no doubt heard about Angle of Attack Indicators (AOA's) invading the cockpits of many General Aviation aircraft - have you decided to put one in your panel, are you trying to determine its value for you, or are you convinced this is a passing fad with no use to you?

We'll describe what AOA's are available on the market today, address the operation of each, how to use them for advanced warning of an impending stall (even when not operating near the bottom of the green/white arcs on the Airspeed Indicator), and how to improve your climb and landing performance while utilizing an AOA.
