Inadvertent entry into Instrument Meteorological Condition, or IIMC, is a leading factor in weather related fatal accidents. Every year experienced pilots and their passengers are killed in both fixed wing and rotary winged aircraft accidents related to IIMC. Many of them are instrument rated. How can this happen?

More importantly, how can you prevent an IIMC encounter from happening to you? How can you survive IIMC? It takes more than just an instrument rating. Join us for an in depth look at IIMC training, prevention and survival. There will be tips on how to develop an effective IIMC training syllabus that is fundamentally different from traditional IMC flight training.

Our presenter, Bryan Smith, Orlando FSDO FAAST Team member, is both an active public safety pilot and safety instructor who has taught classes on IIMC around the world. The material presented here was developed by a group of industry professionals intent on lowering the IIMC related fatality rate. There will be something beneficial for all pilots of all experience levels. Participating in this month's seminar will provide you with 1 credit toward your Basic, Advanced, or Master level of WINGS.
