Declaring an Emergency and preparing your Personal Minimums Checklist

'SAY INTENTIONS!' This is the phrase you'll probably hear after you call ATC and tell them you have a problem. Why is it common practice for pilots Not declare emergencies? If you fail to declare, or hesitate to declare an emergency, you may not get all the help available to assist you with your situation. Rock Rockcastle will discuss why pilots don't call for help and some of the situations where pilots should declare an emergency. Having a plan when something goes wrong will determine what type of help you get. 'PAVEing Your Way to Safety". Using this easy to use personal minimums checklist, tailored to your level of skill, knowledge and ability, you'll be able to fly with less stress and less risk. Rich Burns will help you prepare your Personal Minimums Checklist to help control and manage risk by identifying, and mitigating, risk factors. Using the PAVE system, Rich will discuss some of the factors to consider in making your checklist 'Personal', and planning future updates to your checklist as your piloting skills and abilities change.
