Risk Management in General Aviation - an innovative approach

Two time Oshkosh FFAST team speaker, Ray Heyde, will lead a lively, entertaining, thought provoking, and yet informative presentation on the risks encountered by all pilots regardless of experience or skill level. Risk exposure on every flight contains both known and unknown elements. The session will look at both “how and why” any pilot can arrive at a point of high risk on a given flight. Arriving at that point can be the result of simply not caring, not fully understanding the circumstances, lack of being prepared, lack of valid information, equipment failure, or just plain old bad luck. Understanding the elements of a go/no go decision, regulatory considerations, along with personal and other limitations will assist in a reduction of risk exposure. The course will look at several real life events that present learning tools for all levels of pilots’ skills to assist in avoiding both short term and long term consequences.
