

Taming the ATIS/ASOS

ATIS, or Automatic Terminal Information Service and ASOS or Automated Surface Observation System, is basically a short recorded message which plays on an endless loop. Pilots listen to the ATIS recording before departing or arriving at an airport in order to learn the wind direction, sky condition, altimeter setting (aka barometric pressure), and runway(s) in use. We will break it down to help you get the most out of it.

Directions: From Orlando area take Hwy 441 north thru Apopka toward Zellwood. 3 miles past Plymouth turn left into airport located along 441

From Mt. Dora area take Hwy 441 south thru Zellwood drive past airport on right to first right turn into airport entrance
