Nine (9) lives were lost in accidents where the pilots may have pushed themselves beyond their flying experience and capabilities. Reading the details leaves many of us wondering, "What were they thinking?"

As the NTSB finalizes the official accident reports, we will have an opportunity to review video tapes, ATC voice recordings, and discuss other known facts. This is not to assign blame, but an effort to understand how and why things went so terribly wrong.

Analysis "After an Accident" is always helpful, but please be ready to contribute your own personal experiences that may help keep the rest of us from falling into deadly traps.
