
1. Acting Administrator provides Congressional testimony.

In the wake of highly publicized breakdowns of the NOTAM system last month, the acting Administrator Billy Nolen appeared before the Senate Committee on Commerce, Science, and Transportation on 15 February to present written statements regarding planned modernization of the NOTAM system and other safety improvements for the NAS. 2. Continental releases Mandatory Service Bulletin for crankshaft counterweights.



Continental recently identified a potential safety of flight issue for aircraft equipped with Continental 360, 470, 520, 550 series engines and replacement crankshaft assemblies. As the parts manufacturer, Continental reported this to the authorities and released a Mandatory Service Bulletin (MSB) on February 13, 2023. MSB23-01 preemptively advises that an inspection should be performed to confirm that the crankshaft counterweight retaining ring was properly installed in new and rebuilt engines assembled between June 1, 2021, and February 7, 2023. 3. NTSB launches GA accident visualization tool. In a story that was carried by several outlets, the National Transportation Safety Board (NTSB) has released a new tool designed to help users better visualize information on recent general aviation accident investigations. Called the General Aviation Accident Dashboard, the online tool offers statistical summaries, investigative findings and safety recommendations for GA accidents. The dashboard covers accidents taking place between 2012 and 2021, and includes a tutorial on how to use this new resource. 4. FAA completes rule to increase safety at airports.



In a story out of Washington, DC on the FAA's Homepage for News & Updates on 16 February, the FAA announced a new rule that will help airports detect and mitigate safety problems before they result in accidents or incidents. The final rule requires certain airports to develop and implement a <u>safety management system</u> (SMS). FMI, here is the link to the rule

in the Federal Register: <u>Airport Safety Management System (Draft Federal Register Notice)</u> <u>Federal Aviation Administration (faa.gov)</u>. The rule did not contain a list of airports affected, but is said to affect over 200 US airports, including TIX and VRB, among others.

- 5. FAA issues guidance on applications for Inspection Authorization (IA). In a story that was released on 15 Feb, the FAA has published Notice NOTC2861, addressing revised procedures for IA applications. Every other March is the month for all IA Renewals, where all FSDO's nationwide process applications for IA renewals, and for several years now, IACRA has been the medium of choice. Although the guidance is targeted at Inspectors, if you are an IA, you should know about this new guidance.
- 6. LODA relief granted for most Experimental owners. In a story we have vigilantly followed here since the beginning, AvWeb has reported that now most owners of experimental aircraft no longer need special authorization to get training or checkouts thanks to a notification of policy published by the FAA on Feb. 8. The relief from the requirement for a letter of deviation authority (LODA) for paid training in an experimental airplane was in the James M. Inhofe National Defense Authorization Act passed by Congress in late 2022 and relieved a paperwork nuisance for owners and CFIs. The measure eliminates the LODA requirement in cases where the instructor doesn't own the plane, the plane isn't advertised as a flight training platform and the plane isn't rented as a training aircraft. Basic expenses can be recovered, however. EAA announced the policy's publication earlier this week. FMI: LODA Relief Implemented For Most Experimental Owners AVweb

 - Used as a stop gap legalize, modified from prior & continuing use for experimental aircraft transition training.
 - The Stop Gap is gone no longer needed.

- LODA Experimental Aircraft Transition Training (Pay for aircraft instruction)
 - Specific transition training following a syllabus (reviewed) and other criteria.
 - Usually can not be used for training for rating, certificate operating privilege...



- 7. **FSANA Convention 1 3 Mar in Orlando.** The Flight School Association of North America (FSANA) will present their 14th annual Flight School Operators Convention and Trade Show from 1 3 Mar at the Rosen Plaza in the convention area of I-Drive in Orlando. This is a national-level trade show specifically tailored for the Flight School industry. No info on their website regarding costs to attend, but it is apparently not free. - 8. **5G update.** Last month we reported that the FAA estimates \$26M needed [by Industry] to cover 5G aircraft modifications. The Agency claims that approximately 1000 [presumably Transport category] aircraft will need to install specialized equipment to prevent 5G

transmission interference. Critics say this is a small figure, given the "fuss [surrounding] something requiring a cheap fix." The issue, as our readers know, is the predicted aviation safety impact that is anticipated with 5G deployment near major airports. FMI: https://simpleflying.com/faa-26-million-cover-aircraft-5g-modifications/ That was then. Now, International Air Transport Association (IATA) reports a different figure: up to \$637M. The group warned last week many airlines are at risk of not meeting the deadlines. It said on Thursday: "One can expect flight disruptions post the March and July deadlines unless the FAA and the U.S. government take a different approach to this interference issue." 10. Recap by request: FAA revises legal interpretation regarding allowable Instrument Approach Procedures for the IFR X-C. In a ruling that rescinds a previous legal interpretation, the FAA on March 2022 issued Notice NOTC2305, which will be incorporated into guidance and the Notice rescinded on 8 April 2023. The revised ruling now says that the trainee may perform multiple different approaches, whether using the same navigational aid or different navaids. The important point is for the trainee to perform three different approaches, regardless of the source of navigation. 11. UAS Update: Drone Safety Day announced.

At the 26 Jan GASA UAS webinar (Limited audiences), the announcement was made that this year's Drone Safety Day will be Saturday 29 April. They also announced that henceforth, Drone Safety Day will always be on the last Saturday of April, each year. The theme this year will be Economics, Education, Environment, Equity, and Emergencies, collectively known as the "Five-E's". Note; this event had previously been covered under National Performance Plan item NPP26; the task has been removed from the 2023 NPP. FMI:

- 12. **FAASTeam Training Topic of the Month (NPP01).** How to [legally] give yourself credit for a seminar or webinar. There is a longstanding regulation [61.195(i)] that you cannot give yourself credit for your own training, but what if you attend an event you organized, and want to get credit for it? Assuming others can vouch for you, you can credit yourself in one of two ways:
 - h. Pre-register for the event so that your name appears on the roster, and click your own name during the credit / close-out process;
 - i. Add yourself to the spreadsheet for a Bulk Credit Upload.



The national ACS Focus Team encourages and invites all users of the ACS to please let them know if you see any possible problems or issues with the ACS, or questions not covered already in the Airman Certification Standards FAQ link on the webpage above. 19. **Regulatory Trivia** – A question we have addressed in the preceding month...

Q: I am a CFI and I do not intend to renew my medical certificate when it expires. Can I still provide flight instruction without a valid medical certificate?

A: Yes! Ordinarily, a CFI is required to hold at least a third-class medical certificate; see 14 CFR 61.23(a)(3)(iii). However, 14 CFR 61.23(b)(5) says that a medical certificate is not required when exercising the privileges of a flight instructor certificate if the person is not acting as pilot in command or serving as a required pilot flight crewmember. The CFI should make it clear ahead of time that he, the CFI, cannot act as PIC and that the Trainee must be the acting PIC. It would protect the CFI to have that understanding in writing. Under 61.51(e)(3), the CFI could even log PIC time, but could not act as PIC. There is a difference, of course, between logging PIC time and acting as PIC. The reg's mostly address the acting as part.

- a. **Nationwide:** FDC **0/0367** (see above) covers flights near "qualified stadiums" (defined in the NOTAM) during certain sporting events. Going to the Bahamas? Check this one out: A relatively new "USA" NOTAM, **FDC 2/8783**, covers operations across the ADIZ.
- b. **UAS Operators:** Check out the following:
 - i. FDC 1/8373, covering UAS ops near naval submarine bases (Kitsap, WA and Kings Bay, GA). This NOTAM replaces FDC 0/0229.
 - ii. FDC 1/8374, covering UAS ops near DOE energy facilities and DOD mobile assets, including convoys and ships. This NOTAM replaces FDC 0/0230.
 - iii. FDC **1/0488**, addressing UAS restrictions near "National Defense Airspace". This NOTAM replaces FDC 0/5116.
 - iv. FDC 1/5318 is the overwater counterpart to FDC 1/0488, and replaces FDC 0/0852.
 - v. FDC's 2/8783 and 2/8145 cover UAS ops near Cape Canaveral and KSC.

- c. Don't forget to always check other FDC NOTAM's for the state of "USA" on the above web page, in addition to FL or wherever else you may be going. These NOTAM's are effective nation-wide, with many covering the Washington, DC area.
- d. Finally, if filing IFR, remember to check FDC NOTAM's for the **instrument approaches** at your destination. Like TFR's, these NOTAM's are <u>regulatory</u>, too, so you have to adhere to their applicable portions. The easiest way to obtain this info is via commercial flight planning software / approved websites when filing and obtaining the on-line standard weather brief.
