

Flying Safely as an Older Pilot

- Between 1990 and 2010, the average age of U.S. pilots increased from 40.5 to 44.2.
- This shift is partly a reflection of broad demographic trends.
- To what extent does age impact the performance of the average pilot?
- Is there such a thing as an “average pilot”?
- How far can performance deteriorate without affecting safety?
