CFIT Hazards include Towers Visual Traps and Rapid Weather Changes

Controlled Flight Into Terrain (CFIT) doesn't require mountains — Central Florida pilots contend with tall towers, cranes, antennas, and dense obstacle clusters under the KORL Class B shelf, plus deceptive night-over-water horizons, wetland featureless-terrain illusions, and sudden visibility drops from fast-moving summer convection or haze. This seminar examines local CFIT precursors, from automation slip-ups in congested airspace to database gaps on obstacle locations, and delivers strategies to spot and counter these risks early.
