

GAJSC study of General Aviation CFIT Accidents

- Human biases are patterns of reasoning that weigh the value of information according to pre-conceived beliefs. Biases present as a prejudice in favor of or against one thing, person, or group compared with another; often in a way considered to be unfair.
- Hindsight bias is characterized by a feeling that event outcomes are more inevitable and predictable than they actually are. Hindsight bias can promote memory distortion leading people to think they had actually predicted the occurrence of an event and its outcome.
- Hindsight bias can compromise accident and incident investigations and lessons learned by not considering events from the perpetrators' view.
