

Everything Is Trying to Kill You - But Mostly the Same Few Things

Every accident tells a story - but hundreds of accidents tell a pattern. Rather than examining a single NTSB report, this seminar takes a data-driven look at general aviation accidents in Florida over recent years to identify recurring trends. We'll explore where accidents happen, when they occur, the pilots involved, common factors and the operational decisions that appear again and again. By stepping back from individual events and looking at the bigger picture, attendees will gain a practical understanding of the risks Florida pilots are most likely to face - and how recognizing those patterns can help pilots make better decisions - and avoid becoming part of the next accident statistic.
