# Pilot-Controller-CBP Forum

The mission of the FAA is to serve its customers and to work proactively to ensure the safe and efficient use of the National Airspace System.

Review the proper procedures for communications and operations at our local towered and non-towered airports as well as be updated on new (and eliminated) approaches to our PR airports. Airport signage and markings will also be reviewed as well as procedures and transitions related to expected and actual runway closures. Customs and Border Patrol officers will review the requirements for departing and arriving from non-US destinations (i.e. EAPIS) as well as requirements for returning from the USVI.

The event will last about 3 to 3.5 hours and thus we expect to have food and refreshments provided by a sponsor for the event.

**Directions:** Proceed to the Fernando Luis Ribas Dominicci Airport at Isla Grande, PR. Take the main road toward the PR Ports Authority passenger terminal. Continue past the terminal and the ATC control tower to the Interamerican University Aeronautical Building.
