Risk Mitigation - A Comprehensive Discussion

Background:

Risk management is a decision-making process designed to identify hazards systematically, assess the degree of risk, and determine the best course of action.

Take Away: The goal of risk management is to proactively identify safety-related hazards and mitigate the associated risks. Risk management is an important component of decision-making. When a pilot follows good decision-making practices, the inherent risk in a flight is reduced or even eliminated. The ability to make good decisions is based upon direct or indirect experience and education. It is important to remember the four fundamental principles of risk management:

Directions: From the south via I-75: exit Hwy56 and proceed west to Hwy54. Turn Right on Hwy54 and then turn right on Magnolia Blvd and then right on Songbird Blvd. From the north via I-75: exit Hwy54 and proceed to Magnolia Blvd and turn left.
